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# 'bad economy'

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) secretary-general Ahmad Iqbal Chaudhry, named Prime Minister Imran Khan's directives to probe into motorways built by Nawaz Sharif under the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), either questioning the credibility of China or the institutions under the military.

Speaking at a news conference along with Tariq Fazal Chaudhry, the PML-N secretary-general alleged that the prime minister had a strategy of coming up with these accusations of corruption in the motorways projects as a diversion from "how badly he is demolishing Pakistan's economy and crushing the people".

"This reflects Imran Khan's sick mentality that he did not even think before defiling the image and reputation of Pakistan Army's subsidiaries like Frontier Works Organisation (FWO) and the National Logistics Cell (NLC)," he said.

He maintained that the prime minister's allegations also tainted Pakistan's strongest friend and most trusted ally China, "which is a dangerous act clearly against national interest".

Ahmad who was supervising the CPEC projects under the then PML-N government, stated that various roads had different costs based on their specifications and engineering design according to the land and topographical require-

ments. For instance, he added that a road in a flood-prone area is more expensive and so is a road with more bridges.

He pointed out that the then ambassador of China had tweeted and praised the Havelian-Thakot project as a model of engineering expertise and perfection and had received international award, "while the PTI government is alleging corruption in the same projects".

He challenged the prime minister to write to the Chinese president to initiate an inquiry about the Multan-Sukkur motorway over which the PTI ministers alleged kidnapping in Rs40-70 billion kickbacks.

He stated that the joint investigation team (JIT) report over these allegations was still pending.

"Imran Khan must answer which projects were a victim of corruption, because Multan-Sukkur Motorway, Havelian-Thakot, and East Bay in Gwadar were all directly invested by China and had nothing to do with the government of Pakistan," he added. The PML-N leader lashed out at the government for asking China to renegotiate financials for the energy projects by Chinese companies during the recent JCC meetings.

"Why should foreign investors take the blame for the incompetence and incapacity of the incompetent PTI government... No special concessions were given to China for these energy projects and

they were given some conditions as the rest of the world was offered. But China, on the request of Nawaz Sharif was the only country that invested because at the time not even local investors were willing to put in a single dollar," he said.

He further said that Taru Coal's mining was made possible only with China's help and it will help in producing the cheapest electricity for years to come.

He also criticised Prime Minister Khan for calling the CPEC projects a burden on Pakistan's economy.

He pointed out that the excess capacity was installed keeping in consideration 5.8 growth rate and had that continued under the PTI even this electricity would have been enough.

"But because Imran Khan crashed Pakistan's economy to negative growth, obviously, the demand for electricity was suppressed. On top of that, the demand was further crushed by three times a year increase in the electricity tariffs," he maintained.

"Imran Khan's anti-CPEC rates strikes of Western power grids and is against the interests of the country and its people," he further maintained.

He pointed out that Jaglo-Skardu, Jakkhat-Chailan, Rurhat-Hothob, Hothob-Sohrab highways, M2 Lahore-Islamabad re-service, Lahore-Sialkot motorway, Karachi-Schwab-Rattudero, Thalyan Link

Road were all built by the FWO. He asked the prime minister to tell the nation how much money did the FWO make with these bridges.

He also related the prime minister's statement that Mattiyari-Lahore transmission line was delayed by the PML-N since 2013, whereas he pointed out that its agreement was signed in May 2018 and date of commissioning was set for September 2021.

"The PMJ should have read about things before opening his mouth. This is Pakistan's first high voltage transmission line and the world's second," he said.

No said that it was written in the CPEC document that from 2020 to 2025, it would be the industrial development phase and nine special economic zones (SEZs) were specified in 2018.

He said that the PTI government had to complete the infrastructure of these nine SEZs by 2020 but that did not happen by a single brick.

"Now they are talking about it when it is already two years late," he lamented.

"The PMJian destroyed macro-economics of Pakistan and he should remember that these industrial zones were not government-to-government but business-to-business.

No investor would be interested in a country where currency exchange rates were plummeting and the financial outlook is unstable under the PTI government," he added.

**ISLAMABAD:** The Accountability Court, on Thursday, while hearing Toshakhana case against former president Asif Ali Zardari, two former premiers Nawaz Sharif, Gilani and Nawaz Sharif, and others directed the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) to submit its reply on Zardari's acquittal application on the next hearing to be held on October 14.

Former president Zardari during the last hearing had filed an application before the court seeking acquittal in Toshakhana reference.

The NAB had filed the Toshakhana reference against former president Zardari, two former prime ministers Nawaz Sharif, Gilani and Nawaz Sharif, and others allegedly acquiring these vehicles including BMW 750 Li model 2004, Toyota Lexus Jeep 472 model 2007 gifted by the Embassy of United States (USA), Mercedes Benz BMW 760 Li model 2008 gifted by Embassy of Libya, and gifts from Toshakhana an official treasury where gifts from foreign dignitaries or heads of state deposited in violation of rules and regulations.

Accountability Court-III judge, Syed Asghar Ali, while hearing the case asked the NAB to file its comments on the acquittal application during the next hearing.

At the start of the hearing, Zardari and other accused's counsel filed separate applications seeking one-day adjournment of their client before the court, which the court approved.

During the hearing, the court received statement of prosecution witness Jamad Sheikh Deputy Commissioner (DC) Inland Revenue.

The witness produced various documents related to the case.

The court adjourned the case till 14-October 2021.

According to the bureau, the evidence collected during the course of inquiry and investigation has established that the accused, Gilani in order to extend illegal benefits to the accused, Zardari and Sharif, illegally allowed the retention of vehicles gifted to them by various foreign states and dignitaries, which at that time belonged to the Central Pool of Cars, the Cabinet Division, relaxing the procedure of Toshakhana, illegally.

The accused, Zardari and Sharif, had retained the said vehicles against the nominal payment of 15 percent of total value of the vehicles.

The accused, Zardari, made the payment for vehicles, and duties of these vehicles through the accused, Khawaja Arwer Majid and Khawaja Abdul Ghani Majid, from "fake" bank accounts.

The accused, Gilani, former prime minister and minister-in-charge Cabinet Division from 2008-2012 had "illegally" relaxed the procedure for the acceptance and disposal of gifts, issued by the government through the Cabinet Division OM no/28/2004 TK dated June 25, 2007.

According to these rules, "gifted vehicles shall not be allowed to be purchased by the recipients and be given to the Central Pool of Cars of the Cabinet Division."

# Unvaccinated people to face new curbs

ISLAMABAD: The National Command and Operation Centre (NCOC), Thursday, announced that fresh restrictions will be applicable from today (Friday) for non-vaccinated individuals.

According to the NCOC, people will not be allowed to enter wedding halls, shopping malls, hotels, and guest houses from today (Friday). The NCOC further announced that vaccination certificates will be made "mandatory for domestic travellers from October 1."

The Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) has announced to lift the ban on serving meals and beverages on all domestic flight operations from October 1, following the NCOC announcement of easing Covid-19 restrictions and a downward trend in cases, says a notification issued by the CAA.

However, the CAA has asked passengers and crew members to wear face masks throughout the flight.

The CAA statement added that other Covid-19 SOPs issued by the authority will remain in place.

The aviation authority had imposed a ban on serving meals during all domestic flights in November last year due to the rising number of Covid-19 cases.

According to a spokesperson of the Pakistan International Airlines (PIA), "From October 1, only vaccinated passengers will be able to travel on all domestic and international flights of PIA."

"Vaccination certificates will be checked at the airport upon receipt of the boarding card," he said.

The spokesperson added that the administration of the national carrier has issued instructions to all concerned departments to implement

these policies.

The NCOC has reported 39 more coronavirus deaths during the last 24 hours, taking the overall number of deaths to 27,729.

According to the figure released by the NCOC, 1,742 new Covid-19 cases were detected in the past 24 hours.

After the emergence of new cases, the nationwide cases tally has surged to 1,245,127.

During the past 24 hours, a total of 52,635 tests were conducted throughout Pakistan, whereas, the positivity ratio stood at 3.30 percent.

The number of patients in critical care was 3,768. However, 2,377 patients have recovered from the virus in the last 24 hours, whereas,

the total recoveries stood at 1,169,566.

Furthermore, 457,458 coronavirus cases have so far been confirmed in Sindh, 431,092 in Punjab, 173,796 in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa (KP), 105,417 in Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT), 32,916 in Balochistan, 34,127 in Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK), and 10,321 in Gilgit-Baltistan (GB).

Countrywide, a total 975,361 vaccine jabs were administered to the people in the past 24 hours taking the total vaccine tally to 80,508,569, of which 27,405,873 people have received double doses, while 58,405,873 people have received single dose of the vaccine.
